

ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ORDINANCE CLARIFYING EXISTING ORDINANCES TO PERMIT
DEPUTY MUNICIPAL CLERKS AND SEWER SUPERINTENDENTS, TOWN ATTORNEY, TOWN JUDGE
AND POLICE OFFICERS TO BE NON-RESIDENTS
OF THE TOWN OF FARMINGTON, MISSISSIPPI

WHEREAS, the Town of Farmington, Mississippi, had previously adopted Ordinances requiring the
Municipal Clerk to be an appointed position and to reside within the municipal limits in order to hold such office,
adopted November 4, 1997; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Farmington, Mississippi, adopted an
Ordinance making the offices of Municipal Judge, Marshal, Tax Collector and Tax Assessor an appointed position
requiring such persons appointed thereto to reside within the corporate limits of the municipality in order to hold such
office; and

WHEREAS, circumstances have arisen which require the appointing of the deputy Municipal Clerk, and will
possibly require the hiring of a municipal judge, marshal and other policemen, and a sewer superintendent, and the
tax assessing and collecting has been previously changed to permit same to be done by the Tax Assessor and Tax
Collector of Alcorn County, Mississippi, by Interlocal Cooperation Agreement, which necessitates the amending or
rescinding and/or clarifying of said Ordinances; and

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Farmington, Mississippi, in Special
Session, duly called and assembled at the Town Hall of Farmington, Mississippi, on August 13, 2002, as follows:

Section 1: The office of Deputy Municipal Clerk be and is hereby created, which person shall hold the same
powers as that of the Clerk in the absence of the Clerk, but who shall be under the supervision of the Clerk when the
Clerk is present.

Section 2. It is hereby created the position of Sewer Superintendent as provided under existing Sewer
Ordinance.

Section 3. That the Deputy Municipal Clerk, Sewer Superintendent, Municipal Judge, Town Marshal, Town
Attorney, Tax Collector, Tax Assessor and Police shall not be required to be residents of the Town of Farmington,
Mississippi.

Section 4. This Order shall be in full force and take effect from and after its passage.

Alderman Dale Fortenberry move the adoption of the foregoing Ordinance, which motion to adopt
